

## City of Calistoga Residential Storage and Parking Regulations

Residential storage and parking regulations are intended to safeguard against unsafe and unhealthful conditions which can cause neighborhood decline.

## Parking of Conventional Vehicles (CMC 17.36.070)

- On a developed lot with a single-family residence, <u>vehicles may be parked in the required front and street side yards</u> in the following areas in order to minimize their visual impact on the neighborhood:
  - On a driveway with a maximum width of 24 feet
  - On a parking pad with a maximum width of 10 feet so long as the pad is parallel and adjacent to the driveway, and located between the driveway and the nearest interior property line.
- Parking areas shall have an <u>all-weather surface</u> with clearly defined edges. All-weather does not include areas of grass, lawn, compacted or hard-packed dirt.

## Long-Term Parking of RVs, Trailers, Boats, Etc. (CMC 8.24.050.A)

No recreational vehicle (RV), off-road vehicle, trailer, or boat may be parked or stored for more than <u>72-hours</u> on a residential property except when:

- parked outside of the required front or street side-yard, AND
- on an all-weather surface, AND
- screened from public view by dense landscaping.

## Prohibition on Storage of Certain Items (CMC 8.24.050.B)

Required <u>front and street side yards may not be used for the storage of goods, equipment, and materials</u>, including, but not limited to the following:

- Interior household furnishings, fixtures, and appliances
- Machinery, tools, and equipment
- Boxes and mobile storage containers, except when associated with a move/relocation or the ongoing construction and landscaping activities on the property.
- Salvage materials, scrap metal, and construction materials, except when associated with ongoing construction or landscaping activities on the property.
