COUNCIL REQUESTS AND IDEAS FOR DISCUSSION F)

Irais Lopez-Ortega, thanked the Mayor, Councilmembers and staff for supporting her by attending the Water Education for Latino Leaders Workshop held at the Community Center in December. Announced that the Water Education for Latino Leaders Annual Conference will be held in San Jose March 20 & 21, 2020. Please be prepared for a disaster and look out for your neighbors, especially the elderly.

Councilmember Williams, thanked Councilmember Lopez-Ortega for the Water Education for Latino Leaders Workshop. In November, attended a meeting of the Watershed Information and Conservation Council of Napa County. The WICC is attempting to put in to place a groundwater monitoring program and the County needs to resubmit their Groundwater Sustainability Plan for the Napa Valley Subbasin. Met with Calistoga Dog park supporters and visited the new dog park site. Met with Chief Celaya and the Calistoga Traffic Coalition, discussed noise, speeding, enforcement, bike safety, etc. The Napa Bicycle Coalition will discuss bicycle infractions and safety issues with resorts.

Met with Napa County negotiating team regarding the Acquisition of a Portion of the Fairgrounds to discuss an addition extension of the Due Diligent Period. City Manager Kirn, holiday Luncheon was very successful. About 35 meals were delivered to residents. Planned Interconnection Hub (PIH) being installed to provide electricity to portions of the City during future Public Safety Power Shut offs.
