# CALISTOGA CITY COUNCIL SPECIAL MEETING BUDGET STUDY SESSION

# 1. CALL TO ORDER - ROLL CALL - SALUTE TO THE FLAG

# 3. GENERAL GOVERNMENT

# 3.1 Discussion regarding the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Budget

City Manager overview and Administrative Services Director presentation followed by review of individual department budgets and other budget funds and discussion of next steps.

Acting City Manager and Planning & Building Director Zach Tusinger provided a brief introduction of the budget and introduced Administrative Services Director Gloria Leon who provided a PowerPoint presentation of the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Draft Budget.

- ➤ Police Chief Mitch Celaya presented the Police Department FY 2020-21 accomplishments and the priorities and challenges for FY 2021-22.
- ➤ Fire Chief Steve Campbell presented the Fire Department FY 2020-21 accomplishments and the priorities and challenges for FY 2021-22.
- ➤ Planning and Building Director Zach Tusinger presented the Planning & Building Department FY 2020-21 accomplishments and the priorities and challenges for FY 2021-22.
- ➤ Public Works Director Derek Rayner presented the Public Works Department FY 2020-21 accomplishments and the priorities and challenges for FY 2021-22.
- Parks and Recreation Director Rachel Melick presented the Park and Recreation Department 2020-21 accomplishments and the priorities and challenges for FY 2021-22.
- Council agreed that the retention and staffing of the Police Department should be a priority.

- ➤ Council discussed a request from Chief Celaya for Supplemental Deferred Compensation for sworn personnel and possibly the Fire Department at an estimated cost of \$80,000 for Police and \$75,000 for Fire.
- ➤ Council agreed to fund the Code Enforcement position at a total cost of \$100,000 if full-time.
- Council discussed the additional \$106,000 requested by Bruce Kyse of the Chamber of Commerce for Destination Marking. This figure might be modified with further discussion of the budget.
- ➤ Green Committee, Councilmembers Kraus and Williams expressed wanting to fund the Green Committee, \$30,000 of which \$5,000 will be set aside for countywide JPA.
- ➤ Economic Diversification Study Councilmember Williams preferred that the Chamber undertake this project. Councilmembers Kraus, Gift, & Vice Mayor Lopez-Ortega wished for the City to undertake the study at a cost of \$25,000.
- > Council discussed the addition of a Police Lieutenant position at an approximate cost of \$212,000 and supported the recommendation.
- ➤ Chief Celaya requested clarification on a Full-time Dispatcher position. Council supported the recommendation to hire a Full-time Dispatcher with an approximated cost of \$100,000.
- ➤ Fire Chief Steve Campbell requested three (3) new full-time Firefighter positions at an approximate cost of \$370,000 and the addition of a Seasonal Firefighter position at an estimated cost of \$50,000 which the Council supports. Councilmember Kraus recommended the Chief explore the SAFER Grant as an option when the opportunity opens again.
- Mayor Canning requested staff consider these recommendations and look for other opportunities to reach the goal of maintaining the General Fund Reserves at a minimum of 30%.
- Council opted not to hold the additional workshop previously scheduled for May 12, 2021.
