SUBJECT: REVIEW AND DRAFT GREASE INTERCEPTOR POLICY.

PROCEDURE & INTERPRETATION'S NO. 2009-01

ISSUE:

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Establish a local policy, procedure, & interpretation (PPI) for grease interceptor quidelines in addition to CMC 13.08.425 as it relates to serving establishments such as restaurants, cafes, lunch counters, cafeterias, bars and clubs, hotels, or other establishments where grease may be introduced into the drainage or sewage system in quantities that can effect line stoppage or hinder sewage treatment or private sewage disposal, for review by the Board and approval by the Public Works Director as a local Discussion of further action may be recommended for City Council approval in setting up a formal annual "permitted" monitoring program all existing grease interceptors.

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BACKGROUND:

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18 19 Historically grease traps or interceptors have been required by the City of Calistoga's Municipal Code Section 13.08.425 and the California Plumbing Code currently under Current design and interceptor sizing Section 1014.0 "Grease Interceptors". requirements pursuant to the California Plumbing Code exceeds most retrofit applications. CMC Section 13.08.425 offers an exception for smaller capacity grease traps implementing a daily monitoring program.

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Review and discuss providing direction for a draft PPI NO. 2009-01.
