**ISSUE:** To consider a Resolution waiving "Livescan" fees for resident volunteer applicants.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION: The Calistoga Police Department offers "Livescan" fingerprinting service to the general public. A "Livescan" is an electronically submitted fingerprint card which is searched through state and federal databases for criminal history checks. A "Livescan" is required by many public and private organizations for their employees. A "Livescan" is also required for many volunteer positions; especially those in which the volunteer has contact with children, i.e., coaches, tutors, big brothers/big sisters.

The fee for "Livescan" service is determined by the Department of Justice (DOJ) and is dependent on the type of application processed. The fee most commonly ranges from \$32 to \$51. Also, the City of Calistoga charges a \$20.00 fee which covers staff time and maintenance costs of the machine. For most volunteer positions, the DOJ's processing is fee exempt.

In recognition and support of the local volunteer spirit, the City could exempt eligible local volunteers from paying the City's fee. This action would demonstrate the City's appreciation of the contribution volunteers make to the quality of life in Calistoga.

### Calistoga Police Department Staff Report

February 1, 2008

To the honorable Mayor Gingles and members of the city counsel regarding the Rudolph and Maria Felgenhauer Trust.

The Calistoga Police Department is equipped with an electronic appliance known as a "Livescan" machine. This piece of equipment is capable of obtaining fingerprints and palm prints of arrestees and civilian applicants and transmitting these images via telephone line to the California Department of Justice and/or the Federal Bureau of Investigation for analysis.

The Calistoga Police Department charges a fee of \$20.00 for applicants wishing to be fingerprinted and having an image of their fingerprints sent to the above mentioned agencies. Usually fees are waved for most applicants applying for a volunteer position by the California Department of Justice. If the applicant is not a City of Calistoga resident the Calistoga Police Department charges the usual \$20.00 "rolling fee" to the applicant.

If the applicant is a City of Calistoga resident applying for a volunteer position the Rudolph and Maria Felgenhauer Trust has paid the city's rolling fee. The fees are totaled monthly and paid to the city by the trust. This report is a request to the City Counsel to cancel the rolling fee for Calistoga residents applying for volunteer positions for the following reasons.

- 1. The time used in the calculating the total livescans per month that fall into this category and the associated paperwork that accompanies this transaction by both city hall and police department personal.
- 2. The dollars saved by the trust that could be used towards community service projects, i.e.; Cub Hoops etc.
- 3. The dollars saved by the trust that could be used towards police department equipment and thereby saving the city money for the purchase of operating or safety equipment.

Please consider this request as I believe this procedure would save the city hundreds of dollars throughout the course of the year.
