# MINUTES CITY COUNCIL – REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, AUGUST 4, 2009 - 7:00 P.M. CALISTOGA COMMUNITY CENTER

Mayor Gingles called the Regular Session to order at 7:03 p.m.

In attendance were the following: Councilmember Placido Garcia, Councilmember Gary Kraus, Councilmember Karen Slusser, and Mayor Jack Gingles.

Also present were Pubic Works Director/City Engineer Dan Takasugi, Planning and Building Director Charlene Gallina, Associate Planner Erik Lundquist and Administrative Secretary Lorie Goldbeck.

Mayor Gingles noted that Vice Mayor Dunsford has been excused from the meeting.

**Mayor Gingles** announced that there was no Closed Session held this evening.

**Mayor Gingles** announced a Press Release dated August 3, 2009, was released confirming the first H1N1 related death in Napa County.

**Fire Chief Campbell** reported that it has been confirmed through local sources that this case involved a young Calistoga resident. He noted that the name will not be release at this time out of respect for the family. He introduced **Napa County Public Health Officer Dr. Karen Smith** to give an update.

Napa County Public Health Officer Dr. Karen Smith reported that a press release was issued so that Napa County residents recognize that this virus continues to circulate in our communities and can have very severe outcomes. She noted that the virus has leveled off over the last few days but that they are in the process of gearing up to respond. She also noted that seasonal flu vaccines are expected to begin early this year. She also reported that there are no known school closures at this time and commented on the importance of keeping sick children home.

## **ORAL COMMUNICATION**

There was no oral communication.

### **ADOPTION OF MEETING AGENDA**

It was **MOVED** by **Councilmember Slusser** and **SECONDED** by **Councilmember Garcia** to approve the Council Meeting Agenda. The Motion was carried unanimously.

### COUNCIL REQUESTS AND IDEAS FOR DISCUSSION

**Councilmember Garcia** announced a special meeting for the Hispanic community regarding gang activity on August 11, 2009 at 6:00 p.m. at the Community Center.

**Councilmember Slusser** acknowledged the cutback in Public Works services but requested that if staff sees overflowing trash cans that they stop and clean it up.

**Mayor Gingles** summarized a letter from a local restaurant worker stating that some recyclable items still end up in the regular trash.

 **Councilmember Slusser** reported that there has been discussion about recycling tools for restaurants and that the Waste Management Board is working on ways to address this issue.

**Councilmember Garcia** stated that he has noticed that recycling is not enforced or practiced during public events and requested that people remember to recycle.

# **PUBLIC HEARING**

4) Consideration of Resolutions to amend the General Plan Land Use Map and Land Use Element and Ordinances to amend the Zoning Ordinance Map and Zoning Ordinance, specifically the Community Commercial District. The subject property is located at 963/965 Silverado Trail (APN 011-050-043) within the High Density Residential Land Use Designation and "R3" Residential/Professional Office Zoning District.

Associate Planner Lundquist gave a description of the item noting the General Plan Land Use text amendment to include religious institutions, wineries and tourist entertainment businesses, including bicycle rentals and tours within the Entry Corridor 2 Downvalley Silverado Trail Overlay District and a re-designation of the subject parcel from High Density Residential to Community Commercial. He also noted that this site is not viewed as a suitable location for affordable housing.

**Mayor Gingles** opened the public hearing. There was no public comment. **Mayor Gingles** closed the public hearing.

**Councilmember Slusser** expressed her concerns with the inclusion of bicycle rentals and tours in entryway corridors and gateways. She noted that she did not feel this language should be included in the General Plan and requested clarification.

**Associate Planner Lundquist** called attention to the Resolution noting that this amendment only applies to Entry Corridor 2 and that all proposed projects are subject to the processing of a use permit with Planning Commission approval. Staff also pointed out that this amendment was supported by the Planning Commission at their July 8, 2009 meeting.

Property Owner Joe Cabral, 1330 Diamond Mountain Road, Calistoga stated that he approached the Planning Commission with a request to build a small winery with bicycle rentals and tours and that he is happy with the Planning Commission's recommendation to Council.

It was MOVED by Mayor Gingles and SECONDED by Councilmember Kraus to adopt <u>Resolution No. 2009-063</u> amending the General Plan Land Use Map redesignating the subject property from High Density Residential to Community Commercial.

**Mayor Gingles** introduced the item and opened the public hearing.

the "RR", Rural Residential Zoning District.

**Dirk Fulton, 263 Petrified Forest Road, Calistoga,** stated that he is a family friend of the Arroyo's and they fully support the recommendations before Council. He noted valuable improvements for the City and requested Council's support of the Resolutions.

Being no further public comment **Mayor Gingles** closed the public hearing.

Associate Planner Lundquist gave a brief description of the item and noted that mitigation measures and conditions of approval are included that, among other things, require frontage improvements along Grant Street and because of this work it is likely that the deferred improvement agreements affecting properties in the vicinity will be called when the property owner commences preparation of the necessary improvement plans. The private on site improvements would be constructed upon the development of the first lot.

**Councilmember Slusser** expressed concerns about calling deferred agreements and the considerable expense to the affected property owners. She requested clarification and certainty on verbiage that might trigger calling the deferred agreements.

Associate Planner Lundquist stated that the action before Council does not call for improvements at this time and also noted that the City is required to notify and coordinate with the affected property.

Seeing an affected property owner in the audience, **Mayor Gingles** reopened the public hearing.

**Public Works Director Takasugi** commented that a cause for consideration is that there are a number of projects calling for frontage improvements on Grant Street that, given the proper coordination, can be accomplished concurrently and with economy of scale cost savings. He also noted that the frontage improvements would conform to the Grant Street standards.

Frances Tedeschi, 2777 Grant Street, Calistoga, commented that she was of the understanding that when the City fixed the roadway, the deferments would be called in and all improvements on Grant Street would happen simultaneously. She also commented that she understands that if the City makes the improvements PG&E is responsible for moving the telephone poles versus the property owners bearing that responsibility through the deferred improvement conditions.

**Councilmember Slusser** reiterated her concerns noting that Council and staff need to be sensitive to the costs involved and make it reasonable for property owners to accomplish the improvements. She asked staff to guarantee that the action before the Council to approve the Tentative

Parcel Map would not trigger the improvements on the adjoining properties.

**Associate Planner Lundquist** acknowledged that the conditions of Mr. Arroyo's Tentative Parcel Map do not trigger the improvements on adjoining properties, although, he expressed, the deferred improvements affecting the adjoining parcel would likely be called seeking certain improvements.
