26 27 28	1) Presentation of service award to James McCann, City Manager (10 years of service).
29 30 31	Mayor Gingles presented City Manager McCann with an appreciation award and complimented him for his 10 years of service as Planning Director and City Manager.
32 33	City Manager McCann stated that the past 10 years have been rewarding and there

have been many accomplishments. He stated his appreciation in working with the

current and past City Council members and that he is proud to be part the City.

5) Consideration of a Resolution accepting a donation in the amount of \$43,000 from the Calistoga Fire Association towards the cost of the new multifunction engine.

City Manager McCann introduced this item. He stated that the Calistoga Firefighters Association recognizes the importance of the new multi-function engine and have provided the City \$43,000 towards the cost. He stated that this is the most significant single donation the Association has authorized in its 124 years of existence. He stated that the Association also plans to participate in the renovation costs of the fire station.

It was MOVED by Mayor Gingles and SECONDED by Councilmember Slusser to adopt <u>Resolution No. 2008-012</u> accepting a donation in the amount of \$43,000 from the Calistoga Fire Association towards the cost of the new multifunction engine.

He stated that re-establishing the Reserve Program would 98 complement the current police force and provide training/experience for officers. 99 100 Ric Pielstick, 1805 Foothill Blvd, asked if the reservists would be volunteering and 101 what expenses the City would incur. 102 103 Police Chief Mills stated that the reservists are not paid and the City will provide 104 minimal funding. 105 106 Councilmember Slusser asked if the reservists will have completed police 107 academy (Police Chief Mills stated yes). 108 109 Councilmember Garcia asked if there are any limits to the number reservists at 110 one time.

Police Chief Mills stated there will be a maximum of four reservists supervised by a staff coordinator.

CITY MANAGER REPORTS

122 123 124 Announced a public meeting provided by Napa County Transportation and Planning Agency's (NCTPA) to discuss the County's Strategic Transportation Plan.

- Provided an update on the City's Utility Replacement and Paving Project. He stated that a majority of the project is complete with some minor utility work remaining.
 - Reported that the City is making good progress in discussions with CalTrans regarding the Highway 29/Silverado Trail Intersection Improvement Project.
 - Announced that the Low Vision Group will meet at 1:30 p.m. on February 22nd at Rancho de Calistoga Recreation Hall.
 - Stated that NCTPA Vine Route 11 is offering a 2-for-1 special through the end of the month since ridership has been down.

Mayor Gingles (City's NCTPA representative) stated that if Vine Route 11 continues to have low ridership the route will be discontinued. On a different matter he complimented John Busk for fixing the pot holes on the road adjacent to his property, and he thanked City Manager McCann and Public Works Director/City Engineer Takasugi for their assistance in this matter.

COUNCIL REQUESTS AND IDEAS FOR DISCUSSION

Councilmember Garcia requested an update regarding Solage workforce housing (City Manager McCann responded that pursuant to the agreement with Solage the workforce housing is to be available for occupancy by April 2009).

Mayor Gingles stated his concern that the Calistoga Amigos Program might be eliminated (City Manager McCann responded that there is no intention in eliminating the program).

Mayor Gingles stated that he will be attending the League of California Cities Policy Committee Meetings on April 2-3.
