7 8 BACKGROUND: On February 8, 2010 Town of Yountville Vice Mayor John Dunbar asked the City to consider sending a letter of support to Congressman Mike Thompson requesting federal funding for the continued operation of the residential treatment program at the California Veterans' Home of Yountville.

DISCUSSION: Beginning in January 2008 the Veterans Home in Yountville has been operating "The Pathway Home," a treatment and counseling program to assist veterans returning from Iraq and Afghanistan. The facility is housed in Madison Hall, a former long-term care building on the Yountville Home's 500-acre campus. This program was made possible by a major private grant in the amount of \$5.6 million. The Pathway Home program is managed as an independent program on the Veterans Home's grounds as a project of Tides Center in San Francisco, with oversight by the California Department of Veterans Affairs. Since the beginning of its operation the program has

19 been providing comprehensive treatment and support to over 150 young veterans so 20

that they can continue to recover from the stressers of war or combat or other traumatic military-related issues, and have a balanced reentry into post-active duty life. There are on average 38 veterans in the program at one time, and the average length of stay is four months; family members can be accommodated for a brief stay to help support the veteran's treatment. The program provides a therapeutic environment for veterans to regain physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual strength.

Fred Gusman, the Executive Director of the Pathway Home, reported that Napa County and other local community organizations have been supportive of this program for the past two years. He stated that he foresees a great need for the continued operation of the Pathway Home because many veterans will be returning home as the presence of the military in Iraq is decreased.

Staff recommends that City Council authorize the Mayor to sign the attached letter of support to the Pathway Home program at the California Veterans' Home of Yountville.

It would be a real misfortune if 27 this type of care facility were to fail because of the lack of funding or support by the federal 28 29 government. 30 Please help in finding a way to help the Pathway Home program to continue to care for those 31 32 who have served in Iraq and Afghanistan.
