Mayor Gingles called the Regular Session to order at 7:10 p.m.

In attendance were the following: Councilmember Placido Garcia, Councilmember Gary Kraus, Councilmember Karen Slusser, Vice Mayor Dunsford, and Mayor Jack Gingles.

Also present were Planning and Building Director Charlene Gallina, Police Chief Jonathan Mills, City Manager James McCann, and City Clerk Susan Sneddon.

ACTION OUT OF CLOSED SESSION

Mayor Gingles announced that there was no Closed Session held this evening.

ORAL COMMUNICATION

Kurt Becker, 1715 Michael Way, stated that at the last Council meeting Pubic Works Director/City Engineer Takasugi was "admonished" for performing a chlorine level test of his domestic water at his residence. He clarified that he did not initiate the request for City staff to come to his home for this testing.

Larry Elliott, 4410 Lake County Highway, provided a <u>Communication</u> to Council, and stated his concerns regarding the City receiving wine as a part of the annual compensation for the leasing of City property for vineyard use.

Kurt Larrecou, 1707 Michael Way, stated that he is concerned that the City Manager may have exceeded his authority by requesting additional compensation to the City in the action to extend a vineyard land lease. He requested that the Council consider this matter in a closed session discussion.

 Mitch Hawkins, 1910 Carli Drive, stated on December 13th he lost water pressure at his residence, and debris accumulated in his filtering system; on February 23rd his water had dirt particles in it and he wants to know why the City did not notify him on both occasions of City work was being done.

City Manager McCann stated that the City did not notify the public about limited fire hydrant flushing and testing that occurred on February 23rd. He stated that material gets stirred up in the City's water pipes causing the water to be brown if a significant amount of flushing occurs. He noted that the City will make a point of providing notice via our website of planned flushing exercises in future.

Councilmember Kraus stated that he lives near Mr. Hawkins and he did not experience any pressure loss or discoloration in his water.

ADOPTION OF MEETING AGENDA

It was **MOVED** by **Vice Mayor Dunsford** and **SECONDED** by **Councilmember Kraus** to approve the Council Meeting Agenda. The Motion was carried unanimously.

CERTIFICATES OF APPRECIATION

1 Presentation of Certificates of Appreciation to the following employees: Carolina Wiegers, Police Officer (10 years); and Tim Martin, Police Sergeant (15 years).

Police Chief Mills stated that he is very pleased with Officer Wiegers and Sergeant Martin's performance and commitment to law enforcement and for their long service to Calistoga.

Mayor Gingles presented the certificates of appreciation to both Officer Wiegers and Sergeant Martin, and thanked them for their outstanding service to the community.

COUNCIL REQUESTS AND IDEAS FOR DISCUSSION

Councilmember Kraus referenced a recent newspaper article regarding the City of Santa Rosa getting involved in the class action lawsuit regarding deteriorating PVC pipes, and he asked if the City uses the same type of PVC pipe.

City Manager McCann stated that the City may have installed this type of PVC pipe, although it is not known with certainty at this time. He and Pubic

Works Director/City Engineer Takasugi have been tracking the lawsuit, and have requested that the City Attorney look into this matter.

Mayor Gingles requested that City Manager McCann report back to Council about the progress of a blocked right-of-way off Lincoln Avenue on the Merchant's property.

He stated that on February 25th City Manager McCann and he attended the North Bay Division of the League of California Cities quarterly meeting in San Rafael; environmental sustainability efforts were discussed; Assemblymember Huffman spoke on the State Budget.

- 3. Minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council meeting held on February 16, 2010.
- 4. Adoption of <u>Ordinance No. 665</u>, initiated by the City of Calistoga, for a text amendment to Title 10, Vehicles and Traffic, specifically Section 10.36.80 (Time Limit Parking), and adding Section 10.36.160 (Obstruction or Interference with Police of Authorized Officers), and repealing Section 10.36.100 (Use of streets for storage of vehicles prohibited).

It was MOVED by Vice Mayor Dunsford and SECONDED by Councilmember Garcia to approve <u>Items No. 2, 3, and 4</u> on the Consent Calendar. The Motion was carried unanimously.

GENERAL GOVERNMENT

5. Presentation regarding the Napa Valley Vine Trail and consideration of a Resolution of support regarding the project's case statement.

City Manager McCann provided a brief history of this item. He stated that the Council provided "seed" money for the development of a County-wide Comprehensive Bicycle Facility Feasibility Study, and other communities matched the funding. He stated that the proposed class 1 bike path and pedestrian way would link the upper and lower ends of the valley. He stated that the Vine Trail Coalition has requested that the cities within the County endorse the case statement in order to seek grant funding for this project.

Councilmember Kraus stated the importance of this project in that it would benefit the entire valley's tourism industry, and improve people's general health by getting out and exercising. He stated that the City has a piece in the overall project by the completion of the Washington Street Bicycle Path. He stated that Oat Hill Mine Road to Washington Street is in the planning phase. He asked if the City is obligated to fund any portion of the proposed Vine Trail outside the City.

City Manager McCann responded that his understanding of the feasibility study, efforts by the Vine Trail Coalition, and discussions the Napa County Transportation and Planning Agency make clear that the City is not responsible for funding the Vine Trail outside of the City. He reviewed the improvements that the City has made, and the City plans to make on bicycle/pedestrian paths are a part of the City's adopted Bicycle Transportation Plan.

Mayor Gingles stated that Association of Bay Area Governments and the State have funding available for this type of project.

 Dieter Deiss, 3000 Palisades Road, stated that the Vine Trail Coalition members have not had any discussions regarding City funding of any portion of this project. He stated that the Coalition has offered to assist the City in paying 50% of engineering costs for the proposed Oat Hill Mine Trail to the historic Railroad Depot.

It was MOVED by Councilmember Garcia and SECONDED by Vice Mayor Dunsford to adopt <u>Resolution No. 2010-013</u> of support for the Napa Valley Vine Trail Case Statement. Motion was carried unanimously by the following vote:

6. Establish a date and format for the annual City Council's strategic planning and goal setting meeting.

 City Manager McCann stated that the annual City Council's strategic planning and goal setting meeting will be held on April 13, 2010 beginning at 3:30 p.m.; there will be a dinner break after which time the meeting will reconvene at 6:30 p.m. taking public comment.

7. Identification of topics for discussion during a Special Joint Meeting of the City Council and Community Resources Commission scheduled for March 11, 2010.

City Manager McCann stated that a joint City Council and Community Resources Commission (CRC) meeting is scheduled for March 11, 2010 at 5:30 p.m.; He stated this meeting will provide an opportunity to discuss issues of common interest such as the CRC work program, strategic planning, and community outreach efforts.

Councilmember Kraus suggested including an item in the joint meeting agenda regarding discussions on methods to stabilize the CRC membership.

8. Consideration of a Resolution authorizing a budget adjustment in the amount of \$7,000 from the Affordable Housing Fund Account, and authorizing the City Manager to execute the Amendment to the funding agreement with Calistoga Affordable Housing, Inc. to support the "Rebuilding Calistoga Program".

Mayor Gingles introduced this item and stated that there has been a tremendous response for this program; Calistoga Affordable Housing is requesting \$7,000 in additional funding.

Councilmember Kraus asked if the City's permit fees could be waived.

City Manager McCann responded that the cost of the City's permit fees for this project should be captured in order to designate the amounts that go into the established impact fee account.

Larry Kromann, Calistoga Affordable Housing Board President, stated that they agree with paying the City's permit fees. He stated that they have been amazed at the community response for this program, especially for the seniors residing in the mobile home parks.

It was MOVED by Vice Mayor Dunsford and SECONDED by Councilmember Garcia to adopt the <u>Resolution No. 2010-014</u> authorizing a budget adjustment in the amount of \$7,000 from the Affordable Housing Fund Account, and authorizing the City Manager to execute the Amendment to the funding agreement with Calistoga Affordable Housing, Inc. to support the "Rebuilding Calistoga.
