PURPOSE OF GENERAL PLAN

The General Plan serves two primary functions. The Plan provides 12 information and it states the community's goals, objectives, policies, 13 and implementation actions (i.e., ways to achieve the goals and 14 objectives). The General Plan is a public document and is available 15 for all to read and use as needed. As an information document, the General Plan describes existing conditions, makes projections, and establishes a vision for the community's future. The General Plan provides the public with valuable information about the City and the direction that it seeks to move. Furthermore, as the community changes, there is a need to look ahead and determine the effect of change on the physical, social and economic structure of the community.

As a policy document, the General Plan establishes guidelines for decision-makers. Using these guidelines, the City Council and Planning Commission, as well as, the Community Resources Commission take incremental steps toward achieving the larger goals of the City. The City focuses implementation programs contained in the General Plan through day-to-day operations of the City.

- 39 State law requires that the General Plan include seven (7) elements.
- 40 These elements must cover the following topics: Land Use,
- 41 Circulation, Housing, Conservation, Open Space, Noise and Safety.
- 42 Calistoga combines the Open Space & Conservation Elements. State
- law also allows the City to adopt any additional general plan elements
- 44 that the City deems necessary.
