Mayor Gingles called the Regular Session to order at 6:02 p.m.

In attendance were the following: Councilmember Placido Garcia, Councilmember Gary Kraus, Vice Mayor Michael Dunsford, Councilmember Karen Slusser, and Mayor Jack Gingles.

Also present were Administrative Services Director Bill Mushallo, Interim City Manager William Norton, and City Clerk Susan Sneddon.

# ORAL COMMUNICATION

Jack Lang, 1916 Mora Avenue, stated that the community pool is a great benefit to the community and asked that the pool budget not be reduced.

**Mayor Gingles** stated that several <u>Communications</u> were received regarding the City's deficit reduction options.

# ADOPTION OF MEETING AGENDA

It was MOVED by Councilmember Kraus and SECONDED by Councilmember Garcia to approve the June 24, 2010 Special Council Meeting Agenda. The Motion was carried unanimously.

# **GENERAL GOVERNMENT**

1. Discussions regarding the City's deficit reduction options associated with the upcoming Fiscal Year 2010/2011 Budget.

Interim City Manager Norton introduced this item. He stated that employee furloughs were taken during the balance of the Fiscal Year 2009/2010 resulting in a significant budget deficit reduction. He stated the General Fund deficit is projected to be about \$445,000 for Fiscal Year 2010/2011. He stated that sales tax growth is anticipated to be minimal (approximately 2%), and

 transient occupancy tax revenues are anticipated to be flat Fiscal Year 2010/2011. He reviewed other cost recovery reductions. He stated that the Fire Department employees have agreed to forgo overtime pay during holidays resulting in concessions equaling about 5.5% of salary.

Councilmember Kraus suggested that the City hold off in charging local businesses for fire inspections because local businesses are financially struggling.

**Interim City Manager Norton** stated that Public Works has a substantial reduction in the number of positions. He stated that staff recommends deferring projects such as duct cleaning and roof repair at City Hall and the Community Center.

**Councilmember Kraus** suggested that the City move forward with roof repairs at the Community Center and/or City Hall if they are necessary because the cost may end up being higher if the repairs are not addressed in a timely manner.

**Interim City Manager Norton** stated that the costs of the City Attorney services are under review.

Vice Mayor Dunsford stated his concern in reducing or eliminating the current City Attorney's services because the City is currently involved in two major lawsuits.

**Interim City Manager Norton** provided a brief overview of the recommended Economic Vitality budget reductions.

Chris Canning, Executive Director of Chamber of Commerce, stated that Calistoga is a tourist destination and more than 50% of the City's income is from transient occupancy tax (TOT). He stated that the City needs to increase marketing in order to generate more TOT.

**Councilmember Kraus** asked how much funding the City of St. Helena provided to the St. Helena Chamber of Commerce to promote the City.

Chris Canning, Executive Director of Chamber of Commerce, stated that St. Helena's revenue is based more on sales tax returns.

Kathy Quast, 1300 Washington Street, stated that she is surprised in the suggestion to reduce funding to the Chamber for marketing when they provide a major portion of funding to the City.

Shelly Boudinot, 1414 1/2 Cedar Street, asked that the City's funding to the 81 Chamber not be reduced. 82 83 Doug Cook, 109 Wapoo Avenue, asked that the City's funding to the 84 Chamber not be reduced. 85 86 Ric Pielstick, Calistoga Chamber of Commerce Chairman, stated that the 87 Chamber provides the community with a safe and secure environment. He 88 stated that the City needs to look at the long-term benefit in supporting the 89 Chamber in that it helps provide employment and increases the City's 90 91 revenue. 92 Vice Mayor Dunsford stated that the Chamber should receive adequate 93 funding in order to help revitalize the town thus maintain employment for the 94 businesses. He stated that the City should be run like a business. 95 96 There was Council consensus to not reduce the level of funding to the 97 Chamber of Commerce. 98 99 Mayor Gingles called for a brief recess at 7:35 p.m. 100 101 Mayor Gingles reconvened the meeting at 7:45 p.m. 102 103 Interim City Manager Norton provided a brief overview of the Community 104 105 Resources Department deficit reduction options. 106 Victor Maldonado, 1601 Fillmore, stated that he supports retaining the full 107 time Recreation Technician I position. He stated that having someone that 108 represents the Hispanic community is a plus. 109 110 111 Wendy Lopez, 18290 Highway 128, stated that she supports retaining the Recreation Technician I position. 112 113 Brian Fennen, 1725 Adele St, stated that he supports retaining the 114 Recreation Technician I position. He stated the City's largest personnel costs 115 are with fire and police and not Recreation. 116 117 Heidi Ticen, 1818 West Myrtle Street, stated that she supports retaining the 118 Recreation Technician I position in that he is a good representative to 119 Hispanic community. 120 121 Erik Lundquist, Calistoga Public Employee Association (CPEA) 122 President, stated that the CPEA supports having one day furlough each 123 month for the 2010/2011 Fiscal Year to help address the City's deficit. He 124 stated that if the City realizes an increase in revenue by mid-year then the 125 furlough days could be lifted. He stated that the person that currently holds 126

the Recreation Technician I position benefits the community because he is 127 both bilingual and bi-cultural. 128 129 Richard Reed. Labor Negotiator for the CPEA and the Calistoga 130 Professional Firefighters Association (CPFA), stated the trend is to make 131 concessions to avoid employee layoffs. 132 133 Interim City Manager Norton stated that he received correspondence from 134 the CPEA regarding employees taking one furlough day per month over the 135 next six months thus resulting in a \$48,000 in savings. He stated that this 136 offer is subject to meet and confer with the CPEA. 137 138 Councilmember Garcia stated that he wants to avoid any employee layoffs. 139 140 Vice Mayor Dunsford stated that he would like to see the Planning and 141 Building Department remain open five days per week and avoid cutting back 142 on City services. 143 144 Carmen Lopez, 18290 Highway 128, stated that she supports retaining the 145 Recreation Technician I position. 146 147 Luis Bernal, 1445 Lake Street, stated that he supports retaining the 148 Recreation Technician I position and that it is a plus that the person in this 149 position represents the Hispanic community. 150 151 Councilmember Kraus stated that the employee that currently holds the 152 Recreation Technician I is a role mode to the Latino youth and wants to see 153 154 the position retained. 155 Mayor Gingles stated that Council has ratified to temporarily eliminate payroll 156 increases and cost of living adjustments between now and end of Fiscal Year 157 158 2010/2011. 159 Interim City Manager Norton reviewed the recommended reductions in the 160 Police Department; elimination of 1 of the Community Services Officers, 161 reduction by 1/2 funding of Juvenile Diversion Program. He also reviewed the 162 reduction recommendations for the Planning and Building Department. 163 164 Erik Lundquist, Calistoga Public Employee Association (CPEA) 165 President, clarified that the savings amount that would be realized with 166 CPEA employee furloughs of one day per month would amount to \$98,000. 167 168 Council discussion ensued regarding City Hall closing on Fridays 169

verses City Hall being open five days a week, and also discussed

reducing employee hours per week.

balanced budget for the Fiscal Year 2010/2011 General Fund; in July 2010 the Council will receive the budget for the remaining budgets which will require a meet and confer with the labor groups. He stated that Memorandums of Understanding with the Calistoga Professional Firefighters Association and the Calistoga Police Officers Association will be up for approval in the near future. He stated that a side letter of agreement with the Calistoga Public Employees Association (CPEA) to incorporate suggested changes is being discussed with the members of the CPEA.

Administrative Services Director Mushallo introduced this item. He provided background regarding the City's budget efforts to date, the Fiscal Year 2010/2011 preliminary forecast, and budget reductions options.

**Diane Barrett, 1006 Washington Street,** stated that she supports the City funding the Chamber of Commerce at the existing dollar amount.

Councilmember Kraus stated for now City staff have assisted in coming up with a balanced budget. He thanked the employee groups in their willingness to take reduction in salaries/benefits

Councilmember Slusser thanked the community for their input and staff for sacrifices to help balance the budget.

**Mayor Gingles** stated he is working with the City Attorney to renegotiate the cost of attorney services for the City, and will report back to Council. He stated that the City's recent PG&E energy audit indicated that the two largest energy consumers of the City are the Water & Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Police Department. He suggested that the City look into solar energy to offset the City's expenses.

It was MOVED by Councilmember Garcia and SECONDED by Vice Mayor Dunsford to adopt <u>Resolution No. 2010-051</u> adopting the General Fund Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2010/11. Motion was carried unanimously by the following vote:
