CITY COUNCIL – REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, OCTOBER 19, 2010 - 7:00 P.M. CALISTOGA COMMUNITY CENTER

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Gingles called the Regular Session to order at 7:00 p.m.

In attendance were the following: Councilmember Placido Garcia, Councilmember Gary Kraus, Councilmember Karen Slusser, Vice Mayor Dunsford, and Mayor Jack Gingles

Also present were Planning and Building Director Charlene Gallina, Interim City Manager William Norton, Associate Planner Erik Lundquist, Fire Chief Steve Campbell, Police Chief Jonathan Mills, Building Inspector Cliff Castle, and City Clerk Susan Sneddon.

Mayor Gingles stated that <u>Item No. 9</u> regarding a Consultant Services Agreement with Center for Ecosystem Management and Restoration has been pulled from tonight's Council agenda.

ORAL COMMUNICATION

Dean Moser, Rancho de Calistoga Mobilehome Park General Manager, stated that a letter from Anthony Rodriquez was included in the October 5, 2010 Council packet, however it is his understanding that some of the Councilmembers were unaware that it was included. He stated that the letter requests Councils' consideration in the City establishing a rent supplemental fund to help offset the Rancho de Calistoga Mobilehome Park residents proposed rent increase.

Planning and Building Director Charlene Gallina stated that Council provided direction to staff at the September 7, 2010 Council meeting to work with the City Attorney in establishing a process to receive comments, and to advise staff in preparing an amendment to the City's Rent Stabilization Ordinance (RSO).

City Attorney Kenyon stated there has not been direction from Council to include in the proposed RSO amendment the establishment of a supplemental fund for the park residents proposed rent increase.

He stated his concerns regarding delays in the Highway 128 pavement overlay. 76 77 Councilmember Slusser announced a community meeting on Internet 78 Safety will be held on November 4, 2010 at 6:00 PM in the Community 79 80 Center (Councilmember Garcia gave the same announcement in Spanish).

Mayor Gingles stated that Vice Mayor Dunsford and he recently attended a Napa County Transportation and Planning Agency meeting where Caltrans representatives reported that the Highway 128 and Highway 29 (Mt. St. Helena to the Silverado Trail) overlay projects will be completed in April 2011.

He provided an update regarding a recent meeting with downtown property owners to discuss issues surrounding downtown vacancies.

He also provided an update regarding the notice of rent increases at Rancho de Calistoga Mobile Home Park.

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Police Chief Mills introduced and summarized his staff report on this item.

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Mayor Gingles opened the Public Hearing, and then closed it when no person came forward to speak.

Consideration of an Ordinance initiated by the City of Calistoga, repealing Title 15, California Building Standards Chapters: 15.01 General Provisions, 15.04 Administrative Code, 15.08 California Building Code, 15.12 California Electrical Code, 15.16 California Mechanical Code, 15.20 Uniform Plumbing Code, 15.24 California Energy Code, 15,28 California Historical Building Code, 15,32 California Fire Code, 15.36 California Existing Building Code, 15.40 California Reference Standards, 15.44 Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings, and 15.48 Uniform Housing Code of the Calistoga Municipal Code, and adopting the 2010 California Building Standards Code, Title 24, as adopted by the California State Building Standards Commission.

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Planning and Building Director Gallina introduced this item. She stated that every three years the California Building Standards Commission reviews the newest model Codes: the proposed amendment would become effective January 2011. She briefly reviewed the various proposed amendments to the City's Code.

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Mayor Gingles opened the Public Hearing.

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Michael Quast, 1300 Washington St, suggested that staff provide simplified information to the public to facilitate a better understanding the Code's requirements.

Mayor Gingles closed the Public Hearing.

Councilmember Kraus stated his concern that the City's Building Standards Advisory and Appeals Board recommended that only the Residential and Non-Residential Mandatory Measures from the 2010 California Green Building Standards Code be adopted at this time due to the current economic climate.

Planning and Building Director Gallina responded that the City will still make progress on "green" issues pursuant to the City's Climate Action Plan.

Councilmember Slusser suggested including in the City's "green" initiatives to encourage the community to construct white roofs in order to help reflect sunlight resulting in energy conservation.

7. Consideration of a Resolution authorizing a budget adjustment of \$10,000 and authorizing a request to execute a funding agreement with Calistoga Affordable Housing, Inc. (CAH) in the amount of \$20,000 to support CAH's 2011 Rebuilding Calistoga Program.

Planning and Building Director Gallina provided a brief history of this item; earlier this year the Council executed a funding agreement with Calistoga Affordable Housing, Inc (CAH) in the amount of \$17,000 for the Rebuilding Calistoga Program. She stated that additional funding was received from the Gasser Foundation, DeLong Sweet Family Foundation, and Home Deport Corporation; over 150 volunteers and 14 contractors assisted CAH in this successful effort. She stated that staff recommends that Council approve the proposed funding agreement to support the 2011 Rebuilding Calistoga Program. She stated that all City plan check and permit fees for inspections shall be paid prior to issuance of building permits, and CAH will provide a report detailing activities provided.

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It was MOVED by Vice Mayor Dunsford and SECONDED by Councilmember Kraus to adopt Resolution No. 2010-100 authorizing a budget adjustment of \$10,000 and authorizing a request to execute a funding agreement with Calistoga Affordable Housing, Inc.
